### **The Peralta Adobe**                      **175 West Saint John Street, San José, CA 95110**

11:30 A.M. Sunday, February 18, 2018

The Peralta Adobe was built in 1797 by Manuel Gonzelez, an Apache Indian — also the first resident, and second mayor, of San Jose. The second occupant was Luís María Peralta, who held the highest office in the community as commissioner. Both were part of the Juan Bautista de Anza expedition. The adobe is the last remaining structure from El Pueblo de San José de Guadalupe.

### **The Roberto Adobe & Suñol House**    **770 Lincoln Ave, San Jose CA 95126**

The Roberto Adobe & Suñol House are among the oldest and most historically significant homes in Santa Clara County. The adobe was built by Native American Roberto Balermino c1836. In 1847, Antonio Suñol built the brick Suñol House adjoining the adobe. Suñol owned San José's first store; he was the alcalde (mayor), sindaco (city attorney), sub-prefect (assistant governor), and the first postmaster of San José

Mission San Jose was founded on June 11, 1797 by Father Fermin Lasuen, on a site which was part of a natural highway by way of the Livermore Valley to the San Joaquin Valley. It is the fourteenth of the 21 Spanish Missions in Alta California.

### **Mission San Juan Bautista**                      **406 Second St, San Juan Bautista, CA 95045**

Mission San Juan Bautista was founded on June 24, 1797 by Father Fermin Lasuen . The mission was the fifteenth of the 21 Spanish missions in Alta California. The mission is part of the San Juan Bautista Plaza Historic District which also includes buildings within the adjacent San Juan Bautista State Historic Park.
